

Learning With the Fast and Famous at the National Sports Museum

Nicole Livingstone, Linley Frame and Mike McKay discuss the Olympic dream

Champion swimmers Nicole Livingstone OAM, Linley Frame and rower Mike McKay OAM will discuss the highs and lows of elite sport in a series of special public events at the National Sports Museum during the Winter Olympics this month.

School groups and members of the public have the opportunity to hear these inspiring athletes discuss their respective sporting careers – and the pursuit of the Olympic dream – in these free talks, which coincide with the winter games in Vancouver.

Livingstone competed in three summer Olympics, winning both individual and team medals, Frame won a gold medal at the 1991 FINA championships and competed at the 1992 Olympics while McKay represented Australia at five Olympics (1988-2004), winning two gold, a silver and a bronze medal. He was also flag bearer at the closing ceremony of the 1996 Atlanta Games.
